Troy.

The walls of Troy or Troy – town
are associated with turf labyrinths.
(CG.)

The first Bronze Age foundation of the city of Troy or *Troy – town* indicates a flourishing Hattian settlement. Archaeological discoveries include Assyrian silver and gold leaf jewels and vessels, royal tombs, various stags or bulls, and solar artifacts. These significant finds evidence the beginning of social stratification and wealth accumulation with special focus on Alaca Hüyük or Alaca Höyük. (Troy 1, 3000-2600 BCE. Turkish Museums.) *

* Additional Turkish museum dates for early Troy Levels I and II are 5500 BCE.

According to Knight in *Cumaeen Gates*, the name Troy means maze or labyrinth.

* (CG.) The grid tradition or labyrinthine pattern of *Troy – towns* may originate with Troy's "seven walls represented by seven exterior lines and the entrance made as intricate as possible in order to frustrate an attacking force [or army]." (MAL: 94.)

* (A word of caution: maze and labyrinth are not synonymous: the design of the labyrinth is unicursal whereas the uncertain maze is a uterine design as in meandering.

NOTE 1:

FURTHER RESEARCH SUGGESTED ON THE EIGHT RAYED TEMPLE OF GULA-BAU, QUEEN OF PHYSICIANS. HER BABYLON TEMPLE-HOSPITAL, 3000-1500 BCE, WAS ALIGNED WITH HEAT THERAPIES AND THE CORRIDORS WERE DESIGNED 'IN AN EIGHT-RAYED SHAPE FOR REFLECTING THE SUN AT ITS HEIGHT' (CDBL: 108-9). ALSO GODDESS GULA-BAU'S EMBLEM IS AN EIGHT RAYED SUN ORB (VITAL HEAT) (CDBL: 109) THAT SUGGESTS A POSSIBLE CORRELATION WITH ALACA HÜYÜK SOLAR DISK (RGS).

NOTE 2: THE FIRST BRONZE AGE FOUNDATION OF THE CITY OF TROY INDICATES A CORRELATION WITH ALACA HÜYÜK OR ALACA HÖYÜK INCLUDING VARIOUS STAGS OR BULLS, AND SOLAR ARTIFACTS. (SOURCE: ENTRY ABOVE.)

BULL REVERENCE WAS SIGNIFICANT THROUGHOUT THE ANCIENT WORLD AS EVIDENCED IN FINDS FROM: BULL PROMINENCE AT ÇATAL HÜYÜK, TURKEY INCLUDING BULL SKULLS WITH BUCRANIA HORNS; THE BIBLICAL GOLDEN CALF; MARDUK AND BULL OF UTU; SHIVA'S BULL NANDI; CRETAN BULL-LEAPING, THE MINOTAUR PLUS THE MARATHONIAN BULL; CYPRIOT BULL MASK; AND EGYPTIAN ISIS WITH BULL HORNS AND HORNED DEITY HATHOR.
